# A Message from Pastor Abatelli

It is sad that people feel they can exclude others "just because," rather than include them. In Acts 11, the circumcised believers were upset because Peter ate at the house of uncircumcised believers. They were upset that Peter included them as believers in Christ. This exclusion is seen in all workplaces, all churches and all schools: cliques. But we are called to have fellowship, not be a clique. Cliques are a narrow, exclusive group that is held together by a common interest or view. Fellowship, I would define as a friendly companionship, with people that share an interest or experience, but includes all who want to be involved.

Some have said both are OK to have, but there is a problem with cliques. If you are not on the "in" you are excluded and feel no one cares. This also creates a sense of entitlement and egotistic attitude for those belonging to a clique. Christ did not come to create a narrow exclusive circle, but to include others into the one body of Christ. Christ died for all, so that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again 2 cor. 5:15.

Christ died for all, so that we can be in His family and live for Him. There are still cliques in all churches (Methodist, Baptist, Church of God, Lutheran, etc.) and I wonder, is this how we repay Christ's sacrifices, start cliques? May that never be.

Christ died for all, for all our sin, including the times we may have been a part of a clique. He rose to make sure we know we are forgiven and a part of His family regardless of sin. 1st Corinthians 12 describes us as one body in Christ, one family in Christ. The body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts; and though all its parts are many, they form one body. So it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body- whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free. We are baptized into Christ's family; we are forgiven and are not a narrow exclusive circle but one body, one family regardless of who is there. No one or no thing can separate us from His love.

Nothing separates us from being in His family.

Fellowship is a partnership and companionship we have in Christ that welcomes all and invites all. Fellowship in Christ is an opportunity to be with one another so we can better grow together in Christ, but one big point is, it is inclusive to all. Acts 2:44-47 shows this inclusive fellowship all believers ought to have. And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

In Acts 11, Peter was emphasizing the same inclusive fellowship to the uncircumcised believers. He told those of the circumcised cliques that they got it wrong. Fellowship is to be a way of life for us in Jesus Christ, to want to be in each other's company, to share things together, and to help and support each other physically, mentally, and spiritually, and to be inclusive to all.

Yes, we may not have a lot in common with some people other than Christ, but that is the strongest bond we have: A God blood bond. I have a challenge: since Christ died for all, we are an inclusive family for all, what will your next move be? Include someone that you wouldn't normally invite? Encourage someone that might be having a hard day? Turn around in worship and shake that person's hand to show you welcome them, in Christ's family? What will your next action be to show fellowship?
