

**Parents:** St. Paul is committed to the Christian education of both you and your children. **Grades 6-12 Faith Ignite/Faith Flame: Meets in the Youth Room** – Gr. 6-8 Defend Journals have thought-provoking questions to encourage critical-thinking skills. Gr. 9-12 More in-depth Defend Journals help students defend their faith to those who may challenge them.

**Adults Faith Blaze: Meets in the Parish Hall** Will study God's Word in Pastor's Bible Studies.

#### October is Church Worker Appreciation Month

Just as the Apostle Paul confessed, so divinely called and ordained pastors also confess: "through me the message [of Christ] might be fully proclaimed that all people might hear it ... believe it ... and have saving faith."

God established the pastoral office through Jesus' own institution. He still mandates the pastoral office to this day. Pastors serve in the preaching office. Pastors are sent. Paul uses the Greek word apostello. Sounds like apostle, doesn't it? This apostello, or "sending" happens when God calls pastors into the pastoral ministry and calls them from one congregation to the next. The preaching Paul is talking about is the preaching of the Word of God, centered on proclaiming Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and eternal life. Through the preached Word of God's called and ordained pastors, the Holy Spirit works saving faith in the life and soul of His people ... in your life.

The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod has established other important vocations in the church. Pastors are "Ordained Ministers." We call all the other church work vocations "Commissioned Ministers." These include: the Lutheran school teacher, director of Christian education (DCE), director of Christian outreach (DCO), director of family life ministry (DFLM), director of parish music (DPLM), director of church ministries (DCM), and deaconess. We say these important, sacred and joyful commissioned vocations are "established in love by the Church to support the Office of the Holy Ministry" (LSB Agenda, 222). We appreciate and give thanks for all God's people in their many and various vocations - husbands, wives, parents, children, workers, employers, youth, widows, everyone! Luther names these in his table of duties in the Small Catechism.

But today, we recognize and give thanks to God for those who serve Him and His people in full-time vocations, specifically pastors and commissioned workers. Pastors preach and teach the eternal Word of God for the life and salvation of God's people. The pastor represents Christ to God's people, caring for their souls with the Word of God, with the Body and Blood of Christ, in instruction and Holy Baptism. Pastors speak God's Word into all circumstances of life, especially at the time of death, preparing God's people for eternal life.

The Lutheran school teacher teaches God's Word to our children in the classroom that they may know Jesus Christ, the forgiveness of sins, and life in heaven forever. The DCE instructs God's people with the true Word of God and often influences the faith life of our youth and teens. The Deaconess applies God's Word with acts of mercy to women and children, the aged and infirm, and many more. The Director of Parish Music teaches the Word of God and helps form the faith in young and old through sacred music and the liturgy. The Director of Christian Outreach helps the people of God give witness of the faith through the Word of God. The Director of Church Ministries helps administrate the congregation decently and in good order under the Word of God.

We pray for our church workers, and we give thanks for their work among us. In order to destroy the faith of God's people, Satan targets those who preach and teach God's Word. No work on earth is easy due to the Fall, but the church worker often fights a deep spiritual battle against Satan, sinful sheep, and his or her own sinful flesh. Yet, daily, our church workers fight the good fight — they fight the beautiful, outstanding, distinguished battle of being faithful servants of the Word. They run the race daily, despite little prestige, often low wages, church politics, and work that is seldom measured or completed. Like St. Paul, they often stand alone, with very few standing by them when they teach the faith and strive to make it a priority in the lives of the congregation.

But the work of our church workers is honorable. It is sacred. It is joyful. Our church workers serve the God of salvation and proclaim a Gospel that is the one thing needful for our life and salvation. Our church workers are grounded in Jesus Christ. And God has promised to them and to all who believe in Christ that a crown of righteousness is laid up for them — not because of their merit, but because of the merit of Jesus Christ, whom they serve. And with all who believe in Jesus Christ, our church workers are rescued finally and safely on the Last Day by the blood of Christ. They shall see the day of our Lord's appearing, and like you, be joyously welcomed into Christ's heavenly kingdom.

This month we celebrate Martin Luther and the Reformation, which began when Luther nailed the 95 Theses on the Wittenberg Castle Church door. Luther re-focused the church on Word alone, grace alone, faith alone, Christ alone. Our church workers teach these eternal truths.

Through me ... St. Paul said, "Through me the Gospel might be fully proclaimed." We say this also of our church workers — through them the Word of God is taught to us in whom the Holy Spirit works saving faith. Today, we give thanks to God and pray for our church workers who teach the Gospel from one generation to the next. And all this — life and salvation, the one thing needful for the forgiveness of our sins and our eternal life, is Jesus Christ who says, "through Me you have eternal life." Amen.
