Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The world is changing ever so fast and not so much for the good. That is what I noticed came up in numerous conversations over the past month.

Although there are many bad changes happening, there is a change that is good. Romans 12:2 says, "Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is - his good, pleasing and perfect will." When we are caught up in this world, we need a change or transformation of how we think and that in turn will change how we live.

This month is special for the Christian church because it includes the (506th) anniversary of the Reformation. Martin Luther helped introduce the big change (reformation) in the minds and hearts of many believers. He helped the Church return (be reformed) to what the Bible actually says instead of relying upon human ways of thinking.

Because sin infects all of us and produces thoughts and actions contrary to God's will, there is a need for our lives to be transformed by a new way of thinking and living. God provides a way for this needed change to occur for each of us. First, do you recognize any area(s) of your life that needs change for the better? Jesus came to set you and me free from punishment for all of our sin. Second, the Holy Spirit can help each of us change for the better. These two works of God are called Redemption and Sanctification. This is the good change that God does for us.

Our theme this year states that we want to equip, build and grow together. Each of these aspects will change for the better as we spend time in the Word of God. If you are not already spending time each day in God's Word, I urge you to try it. Join the book of the month Bible reading plan. We also have several Bible studies available at church and in member homes. Make an effort to be in the Word with your fellow believers. The fellowship and discussion will strengthen your relationships and faith. These are good changes to make. As Paul wrote, "Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is - His good, pleasing and perfect will." Time in God's Word will result in a change in how we live for God. A blessed Reformation to you.





Benefits of Church / Appreciation Month

Benefits of Joining and Attending a Church:

- Being a part of the Christian Church is always something that God wants for us and what He initiates by the work of the Holy Spirit. The following list of benefits extends beyond the gift of salvation that comes through faith in the work Jesus did for us on the cross (Eph. 2:8-9).
- Joining a church says to the public you are a Christian and that you are a member of God's own people, who are called "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation" (1 Peter 2:9). Attendance at church brings you into the presence of Christ Himself! What can be better than that? "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them" (Matthew 18:20).
- It says you believe in Jesus as your Savior. It also acts as a witness to the Christian faith and as an example to others. It means you are doing what the very first Christians did in devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to prayer (Acts 2:42).
- It means you will be able to receive the encouragement, strength, prayers, Baptism, the Lord's Supper and the application of God's Word from fellow Christians and a pastor, which you may not have the privilege of receiving as a non-member or as someone who attends infrequently (Hebrews 10:23-25).
- It will tell other Christians and the world you have considered it an important matter to be able to join together with Christians to support the work of the church in calling a pastor, providing instruction in the Christian faith (for the youth, adults, the older set), sharing the message of Jesus locally and in mission work abroad. Membership and attendance says you are willing to participate personally in the work your church has in serving others as Christ first served us.
- It would not only be a witness to other people, who you are and what you are about, but it would show God that you are not just talking about and maybe doing half-heartedly what He expects, but that you are involved whole-heartedly in doing what He desires.
- Joining a congregation is a powerful declaration that you know Jesus provides His people, as a group, every spiritual gift (1 Cor. 1:7-9) and all the resources needed (2 Cor. 9:7-8) to do the things of God.

There are truly many benefits to being a member of the Church. Thank God we are! "I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" (Phil. 1:3-6).
