THE LUTHERAN CHURCH MISSOURI SYNOD Newsweek magazine once published a piece on "The Toughest Job in the World," a reference to making decisions. Let's replace "making decisions" with "being a disciple." It reads like this: "It can be more fatiguing than a day of stonecutting. It can be more nerveracking than a day of heart surgery. It can bring success, happiness, life . . . or failure, unhappiness, death. In today's security conscious society, it's a job fewer people want to tackle. It's not for the fainthearted who are afraid to fail. It's not for the reckless who can be dangerous. It invites ridicule, criticism, and unpopularity. But without it the world stands still. It is the lonely, ulcerous, precarious job of being a disciple."

And one of the primary tasks of a disciple is to make more disciples. To this end, the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) has created a new initiative called "Making Disciples for Life (MDFL)" that will assist us, as disciples, as we witness to Christ and His eternal gifts. All of the resources for MDFL can be found at: https://makingdisciples.lcms.org/.

MDFL will put field-tested, theologically solid resources at the fingertips of God's people 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. The initiative is rooted in Jesus' words in Matthew 28: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19– 20).

The Church today faces many challenges and opportunities. Among these are evangelizing the lost, retaining the faithful, strengthening congregations, and planting congregations. All of these are included in Jesus' words to His disciples. The One who has all authority commissions His Church to share the Good News with the whole world. The faithful regularly gather around Word and Sacrament. In a world in which people are tempted to leave the Church, congregations are working to retain those who have joined. To assist us, MDFL has created and will continue to create resources to help congregations reach out to the lost, retain and strengthen the baptized from the cradle to the grave, provide leadership resources, strengthen Lutheran families, and plant new churches.

I've only begun to scratch the surface of this initiative. More resources are being made available all the time. I'm looking forward to sharing and discussing these with you in the near future.

But you don't have to wait for me or Pastor Bruner! You can look and learn for yourselves! Jesus calls all Christians, including you, to make disciples for life! And since many of us feel inadequate, MDFL is made to equip, encourage, and excite us for this most important work.

As mentioned at the beginning, this task invites ridicule, criticism, and unpopularity. But without it the world stands still. It is the temporally risky but eternally rewarding job of being a disciple, and making disciples for life.

Please remember, Jesus is with you always. He will empower both your encouragement of being a disciple, and your excitement to make disciples for life. For this is the field we are called to labor in by our Lord.

"Therefore, my beloved brothers [and sisters], be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58).
