A new school year is upon us. And it began in an unexpected way. As you undoubtedly know, a car was driven into our computer lab two weeks before school was to begin. Thankfully, according to God's mercy, no one was seriously hurt. And our building is already undergoing repair. This unexpected beginning to our school year got me thinking about other unexpected beginnings.

Let's start with creation. Out of nothing, God unexpectedly created everything visible and invisible. This included His crown jewel: Humans, Adam and Eve. Abraham was called unexpectedly from all the people of the earth to move and begin the line of God's chosen people. As this school year begins, may we show unexpected grace, mercy, love, and hope to our staff, students, members, community, and world.
